Legendary death-rock pioneer Dave Grave is an artist, model builder, and front man for the band Frankenstein. He also stars as Ray Bradbury's childhood idol, Mr. Electrico in Live Forever: A Ray Bradbury Odyssey. Devin O'Kelly could be said to have started Live Forever: A Ray Bradbury Odyssey. Originally given the privilege of

interviewing Ray for his school project, Devin's questions enchanted the author and sparked what would be come a friendship shared between Ray and the entire O'Kelly family. Shawn Clement's music for Buffy the Vampire Slayer is a fan favorite for both score and song. As a film composer, his projects have won festivals worldwide. He is now the composer for Live Forever: A Ray Bradbury Odyssey. Michael O'Kelly is an artist and musician turned screen writer, producer, and director thanks to his friendship with fantasy legend Ray Bradbury. Through conversations with Ray, Michael came to realize that the author may truly hold the secret to living forever. Thus, the documentary was born. Christopher Moonlight is co-director and production designer for Live Forever: The Ray Bradbury Odyssey. He is also the publisher of Moonlight Art Magazine, featuring comics and interviews, as well as a children's book author, and the director of several upcoming sci-fi and horror short films. Scott De Roy had the please of acting in the Ray Bradbury Film, Something Wicked This Way Comes.

Intro to Careers in Comics

Moderated by Joshua Hale Fialkov & Rob Levin

From critically-acclaimed writer Joshua Hale Fialkov (*I, Vampire, Last of the Greats, Doctor Who, Echoes*) and veteran writer/editor Rob Levin (*7 Days From Hell, Abbatoir*) comes an insiders look at breaking into, making, and having a career in comic books.

Intro to Careers in Comics - \$45 for a two hour seminar (includes your admission to the show) and is strictly limited to 30 seats. So you want to make comic books? You've come to the right place. This class will teach you everything you need to know about turning your great idea into an actual comic book. Learn how to harness your ideas and make them work in the comic book format. This includes honing your idea, the ins and outs of comic book scripting, and understanding the medium as a storytelling tool. Learn how to find artists and other collaborators including editors, letterers, designers, and production

artists. Lastly, we'll discuss the most important part of the process: Getting your book seen. This class will teach you what needs to be done before a single page gets drawn, what pitfalls to avoid, and how to see your project through to completion.

About the Instructors: Joshua Hale Fialkov is the Eisner, Harvey, and Emmy nominated writer of the graphic novels Echoes, Tumor, Elk's Run, and the Last Of The Greats. He's worked for every major comic publisher as well as for the biggest book publishers in the world. He's written Batman/Superman and I, Vampire for DC Comics, Wolverine, Iron Man 2.0, and Spider-Man for Marvel, Doctor Who for IDW Publishing, Vampirella for Harris Comics, and more. In 2009 he was nominated for an Emmy award for his work on the animated feature Afro Samurai: Resurrection. He also served as the Executive Producer of the hit webseries Lg15: The Resistance. He lives in Los Angeles with his wife and daughter.

Rob Levin is a writer and creative consultant with nearly a decade of experience editing comic books. He has worked in nearly every aspect of comic book publishing and is the former Vice President - Editorial at Top Cow Productions where he pioneered the innovative *Pilot Season* publishing initiative. He also developed projects for Image Comics, Archaia, Radical, and others. His comics writing includes the critically-acclaimed 7 Days From Hell, The Darkness, Broken Trinity: Pandora's Box and Netherworld for Top Cow, and Abattoir for Radical.
